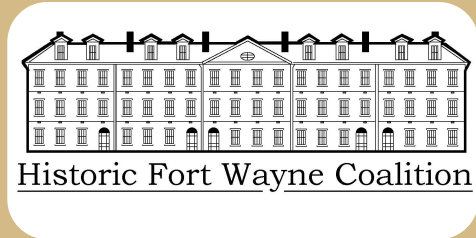

- ★ **Shrine Catholic High School: 9/14:** First Principle of Equality (gender); Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony; Seneca Falls Declaration of Sentiments and Resolutions and 19th Amendment; and the Suffragist Flag
- ★ **Cooley Law School, Black Law Students Association: 9/15:** First Principle of Equality (racial); Abraham Lincoln, Frederick Douglass, and Martin Luther King Jr.; Gettysburg Address, Emancipation Proclamation and I Have a Dream speech; and the Union (Fort Sumter) Flag
- ★ **Cornerstone Schools Association: 9/16:** First Principle of Unalienable Rights; Thomas Jefferson; the Bill of Rights; and the Gadsden Flag (Don't Tread on Me)
- ★ **Rochester Adams High School: 9/17:** First Principle of Limited Government; James Madison; unamended Constitution, 9th and 10th Amendments; and State, County, or Municipal Flags
